WE ARE THANKFUL TO GOD that we are able to partner with preachers like 29-yearold Wang Hai, to bring God's Word to remote areas of China. I'd love to share with you his story...

Wang Hai is a preacher and church planter from the Miao ethnic group. He's one of 24 young preachers who recently received a motorbike from Bible Society to help his ministry and Bible distribution. Before receiving this bike, Wang used to walk for days up and down the mountains. Now, his journey to visit remote villages is on average five hours. Wang has been the only preacher in his village for the last 12 years. He ministers among the poor – and endures harsh conditions just like them. 'After graduating from Bible seminary I was leading a group of 200 Miao believers,' he told me. 'Poverty was rife and I drew no salary. During a poor harvest we would often go hungry.'

From a young age, Wang knew he wanted to dedicate his life to serving God. His family sacrificed much to put him through Bible college. Afterwards, he returned to Trinity Church – his home church in the mountains – and under his leadership it has gone

from strength to strength. He has helped reach out to other ethnic groups and runs bilingual services.

Wang heads out on his motorbike at least two or three times a week. 'There are places where there are new believers and they don't have Bibles. I use the motorbike to bring Bibles to them,' he explained. He often shares the Gospel in other villages on his journey. In 2010 he began preaching in one village, and there are now 50 Christians there.

Wang told me it's not unusual for these communities to meet in worship until 2am or 3am during his visits. Maybe it is difficult for them to see their shepherd often, or maybe it is because they thirst for God's Word that they treasure every moment together.

'There is a shortage of pastors and God is willing to use me,' says Wang. 'Thanks to Bible Society supporters I now have this motorbike to visit people in the mountains. My body may ache after riding long distances, but my heart is happy. In winter, when the road is icy, I tell God that the

steering is in his hands, and I have never fallen. This bike is a tool for God's service.'

Despite his young age, Wang is wise, selfless and dedicated. We are grateful to God for the chance to serve alongside him, and I'd ask you please to keep him in your prayers.

NEW MODERN LATVIAN BIBLE A SELL-OUT

Latvian Christians have had their first taste of God's Word in today's language, with the launch of a new ecumenical translation of the Bible – and it sold out in just three days.

The translation was launched in Riga, Latvia's capital, and the event was covered on national television. Among those who queued outside a bookshop to buy a copy was theology student, Eva.

'We're so excited that the new Bible has arrived and I want to

get it as soon as possible,' said Eva. 'We've waited so long for this and are really grateful this day has finally arrived!' She said the old translation, which dates back to 1965, contains words which are hard for people to understand.

All 3,000 copies of the Bible were sold within three days, at the launch events and via churches and bookshops.

Bible Society General Secretary Valdis Teraudkalns said, 'We must do everything we can to make sure the Bible is accessible to anybody who wants it, so the next step will be to make it available to download.

'We are committed to experiencing the Bible in our own lives every day and to letting other people know that it can surprise and encourage us in all life's circumstances.'

The Latvian Bible is one example of the many translation projects managed by United Bible Societies, which your donations support.

IN NOVEMBER, China's Amity Printing Company celebrated as its 100 millionth Bible rolled off the presses. Two thirds of these have gone into the hands of Chinese Christians. The rest have been exported around the world.

The landmark is testament to the continued extraordinary church growth in China – and

the Bible has seen an amazing turnaround from banned book to bestseller. Just over 40 years ago, copies of Scripture were confiscated and often burned. When the Cultural Revolution ended, the Bible was first printed on the press that had formerly produced Mao's *Little Red Book*. Today, the printing factory is vast, and the state-of-the-art equipment can produce a Bible every second.

Thanks to your support over the years, millions of Chinese Christians now hold the Bible they longed for. Through subsidising paper, you have put copies of Scripture into the hands of a whole generation.

PRAYER POINTERS

- Give thanks for the amazing church growth in China. Pray that Amity Printing Company will be able to meet this huge appetite for Scripture. Pray for staff there, for energy and wisdom in their work.
- Pray for preachers like Wang Hai (see eyewitness report), ministering to rural communities in China. Pray for strength and safety as they travel long distances, and pray for the spiritual growth of these remote groups of Christians.
- Part of our mission in China is to train pastors, by supporting them at Bible college, giving them resources and skills to minister to their church. Pray that the programme reaches the right people and equips them to lead.
- Many Christians in rural China are illiterate and are unable to read the Bible for themselves. Thanks to your support, we're now running literacy classes to help them. Pray that students would be diligent in their studies and would be motivated by the reward of reading Scripture for themselves.

Thanks to your support Brehanu Tadesse's life has been transformed by the Bible

IN YOUR LETTER with *Bible a Month*, you can read the story of Brehanu Tadesse, 42, who lives in Ethiopia. He used to be an angry man who used to fight and beat people up in the street. 'I hated everybody,' he said. 'It was a miserable life.'

But thanks to your regular gifts, he encountered the

Scriptures through listening to an audio Bible called a Proclaimer – and everything changed.

Faith Comes By Hearing project manager in Ethiopia, Endrias Kacharo, said, 'It's the time of God now. It feels like the biggest revival I have ever known. People are becoming Christians. In the next year we would expect more than 10,000 converts because of the Proclaimer.'

The Proclaimer is available in 10 languages in Ethiopia, but up to 80 languages are spoken across the country.

Bible Society in Ethiopia has set up around 1,500 Bible listening groups in the past year thanks to your support.


